Personal, social and emotional development

Children's personal, social and emotional development is central to their learning and we support this through the development of positive and caring relationships. Each child has a Key Person and a key group of 13 children.

Respect for children's rights runs through our work with children and we have achieved a Gold Unicef Rights Respecting School Award. This helps develop children's self confidence, understanding of difference and diversity and supports the development of a strong moral compass.





Staying Safe

At Goodway Nursery School the safety and well being of children is of the highes importance to us. We are committed to safeguarding and promoting the well being of all children.

We aim to support the development of children's confidence, resilience, security and ability to explore and learn and provide an environment in which they feel respected safe, secure, and valued. We teach children about keeping themselves safe and support parents with keeping children safe on line.

Staff are well trained in the need to safequard children and of their responsibilities to identify and report possible cases of abuse and have effective working relationships with other agencies involved in safeguarding children. The Head Teacher is the Designated Safeguarding Lead and there are two Deputy DSLs. All staff employed by the nursery school have enhanced criminal records checks.

All concerns are logged using a secure on line monitoring system called My Concern. When the school has concerns about a child, the Designated Safeguarding Lead will decide children eligible for Early Years Pupil what steps should be taken.

We offer Early Help, which means taking action to support a child or their family early in the life of a problem, as soon as it emerges. We will access support from other agencies to ensure the child gets the right response, and the right services, from the right people at the Children with Special Educational Needs right time. Our aim is to meet need early and avoid a problem escalating or the need increasing.

We uphold the principles and values outlined in The Prevent Strategy for combating extremism and our staff are trained in the forms that extremist behaviours may take. Systems are in place to address concerns regarding extremism, FGM, sexual exploitation of children and child trafficking as well as other forms of abuse.

Please let us know if you have any concerns about your child's safety or welfare, and let us know if your child has had an accident or hurt themselves at home.

If you have a safeguarding concern about a child please talk to Beth O'Neill, the Head Teacher, our Designated Safeguarding Lead.

The Nominated Governor with responsibility for child protection at the school is Satwinde Jandu. She is responsible for liaising with the Designated Safeguarding Lead over all matters regarding child protection issues.

We ask you to avoid using mobile phones in the Nursery School grounds. We believe that the drop off and collection of young children should be a special time that focuses on the children.

Playing and learning

We believe in child centred learning and plan for learning using the Development Matters in the Early Years Foundation Stage guidance which sets out what a child is expected to learn from birth to five.

We plan activities to meet needs identified from observation and assessment, and extend children's learning through a balance of adult led and child initiated activities. Our children love coming to school and enjoy an exciting range of learning opportunities that extend the range of their experience.

We focus on core stories, developing children's love of stories and they take part in daily phonics, and story sessions as well as maths and PSED.

Children take part in yoga sessions and forest school every fortnight. Drama students work with the children to develop their communication and language and creative development through imaginative role play and story making.

Children take part in Forest School sessions each afternoon with our qualified Forest School Leader, where children learn about and explore nature.

Targeted small group work supports children with communication and language needs and a well-being group supports those with lower emotional wellbeing. More able children are supported through a phonics extension group and Premium work in a small group with our teachers and take part in weekly yoga sessions.

and Disabilities are supported with one to one work, visual aids, pre-tutoring with language used for planned activities, choice boards and pictorial timetables.

Our staff team of highly experienced teachers and teaching assistants work together to provide an exciting range of learning opportunities that engage children of all needs and abilities, and encourage them to become confident and independent learners.

We want to work together to make sure that your child enjoys their time at nursery school and achieves their best, preparing them for the next stage of their learning journey.

Our School Values

We believe that children learn best by actively pursuing their interests and ideas through play. Play allows them to explore ideas, feelings and relationships. We encourage children to become independent learners by providing them with opportunities to play, explore investigate and follow their own interests, as well as being taught for a short time each day in their key groups.

Our experienced staff team facilitate the child's process of creating and developing theories about the world, helping them to problem solve through open ended questioning and differentiated responses.

We value learning outdoors, and believe that being outdoors has a positive impact on children's sense of well-being and on their development. Children have access to the outdoor learning environment throughout the day, supporting the development of healthy and active lifestyles by offering children opportunities for physical activity, freedom and movement, and promoting a sense of well-being.







We provide full and part time places for 152 two to four year olds, offering 15 hours of nursery school provision. We offer 30 hour free childcare places to children who meet the criteria. Please call in to discuss this or check our website if you think you may be eligible. You can also pay for a 'Top up' place if you are not eligible.

We offer wraparound care from 8am to 5pm, where your child will be looked after by our own experienced Teaching Assistants. Please ask at the school office if you would like a wraparound place for your child.







Wraparound Care

Wraparound care is run by our own Teaching Assistants. It is flexible and you can change your booking weekly in advance (depending upon availability of spaces).

3pm – 4pm @ £5 (including snack)

3pm – 5pm @ £10 (including light tea)

Inclusion

We believe in inclusive education and aim to meet the needs of all children regardless of learning difficulty, disability, disadvantage or special educational needs. We know that all children are entitled to have their individual needs met so that they can achieve their potential across the early years curriculum. We seek positive solutions to provide equality of opportunity for children with Special Educational Needs & Disabilities so that they are able to learn alongside their peers. All staff have high expectations for children and plan differentiated learning to build on what children know and understand. Staff know their key group very well and children are continually assessed so that Special Educational Needs & Disabilities are identified as early as possible. Parents are involved at the earliest opportunity, so that they are fully involved in decisions and support can be put into place.

Our purpose built nursery learning environment is all on one level with accessible toilets for children and adults and we encourage independent learning though our planning and resourcing according to children's needs and interests.

Our Special Educational Needs & Disabilities Coordinator (SENCO) is Lorraine Jones and our Assistant SENCO is Helen Cox (Teaching Assistant). Our named governor with responsibility for SEND is Nicola Shergold-Clevett.

Clothing

Children should wear clothes that they can manage easily for toileting. Remember that some nursery activities can be messy, so please dress your child in clothes that can be easily cleaned. Uniforms are not obligatory but you can order nursery sweatshirts and polo shirts online at www.myclothing.com

Food

We encourage healthy eating habits with fruit for our snack and milk and water available for children to access throughout the day. We ask you provide a healthy packed lunch for your child and not to send any sweets or snacks.

Some children are entitled to a free school meal, which is made fresh each day by a local primary school. Please check at the school office if you think you may be eligible.

Illness and accidents

f your child has regular medication such as an inhaler, we will ask you to ign to give us permission to administer the medication. Please let us know if your child has any allergies.

Your child will be introduced to nursery by staying for a short time at first so that we get to know each other, increasing to the full day.

Some children take longer to settle than others. We believe that it is important to go at their pace, so children can stay for the full day when they are ready to do so.

Your child will be allocated a Key Person who will welcome them each day and is responsible for monitoring their learning and development. There is time each day for you to share information and talk to them informally about your child's progress, as well as termly Parents' Meetings.



We follow the Health Protection Agency Guidance for exclusions due to Iness. If your child is ill and requires medicine, such as antibiotics, during he day, we ask that you keep them at home or make alternative childcare arrangements for at least the first two days of taking the medication.

School Fund

We ask for a contribution of £2 per week or £10 per half term for School Fund. This goes towards the cost of fruit, cookery ingredients, additional resources and special events.
