

Charter for Water Play





Article 29

We have the right to learn and develop

Education must develop every child's personality, talents and abilities to the full. It must encourage the child's respect for human rights, as well as respect for their parents, their own cultures and the environment.

Children will:

- Wear an apron to keep my clothes dry
- Use water from the water butt to water our plants
- Turn off the water butt tap when I have filled my container, to conserve water
- Keep my friends dry
- o Put nothing in my mouth
- Only put our hands in the water
- o Share resources with my friends
- o Put nothing in my mouth
- o Ask an adult if I need help

Adults, as duty, bearers will:

- Teach children how to put on an apron
- Teach children how to turn on and off the water butt tap
- Teach children how to water our plants
- Provide 'challenge' ideas on white boards
- Talk about size, volume, shape and quantity
- Encourage children to hang up their apron

Parents and carers, as duty bearers, can:

- Encourage your child to help water plants in the garden or house
- Provide jugs, cups etc for children to play with in the bath
- Talk about size, volume, shape and quantity
