



Article 16

We have the right to keep some things private

Every child has the right to privacy. The law should protect the child's private, family and home life.

Children will:

- Tell an adult if I need help
- Close the door
- One person in each toilet
- Respect the privacy of my friends
- Do a wee or poo in the toilet
- Wipe my bottom with toilet paper
- Put the toilet paper into the toilet
- Flush the toilet
- Wash my hands with soap
- Keep the water in the sink
- Dry my hands

Adults, as duty, bearers will:

- Encourage children to use the toilet
- Praise them for their attempt to use the toilet
- Explain to them how to wipe their bottom

Parents and carers, as duty bearers, can teach:

- Working with your child's key person to toilet train your child as soon as they seem ready
- Be consistent- once they have stopped wearing a nappy, do not put them back into one.
