

Home Learning Pantosaurus



This week our core book is Pantosaurus. The NSPCC pants topic helps children understand their body belongs to them, and they should tell a safe adult they trust if anything makes them feel upset or worried. This week we have been talking about our right to be safe, how to say "no" and who our trusted grown ups are that we can talk to about anything.

In the story Pantosaurus is very excited to have some new pants so your home learning challenge is to design your own pants. You can use pens, crayons, paints, play dough or anything you have at home.

I'm sure you all like to help your grown ups at home, perhaps you could help with the washing. Pegging out washing is great for developing fine motor skills. Matching socks is great for mathematical development talking about patterns and counting pairs. How many socks are in the wash this week? Who has the biggest socks? Who has the smallest socks?
