

Summary of Protective Measures



Keep children with any symptoms at home

Children with any symptoms should be kept at home: A high temperature; A new, continuous cough; A loss of, or change to, sense of smell or taste

If a child becomes unwell at nursery, parents or carers will be asked to collect them immediately

Staff will wear PPE when caring for a child displaying symptoms

Parents or carers will be asked to arrange a test for their child

If they have a negative test result the pupil can return to school when feeling better

If the test result is positive, they should self-isolate for 10 days and the pupil's household is to self-isolate for 14 days from the onset of symptoms

If a child tests positive for coronavirus, we will contact the Local Health Protection Team for advice. The staff and any individuals in the child's bubble are sent home to self-isolate for 14 days from the onset of symptoms



Staff who are symptomatic will not attend school

All staff who have coronavirus symptoms, or who have someone in their household who does, should not attend nursery under any circumstances.

If staff develop coronavirus symptoms, they will be asked to arrange a test

Staff can return to nursery after 10 days if they test positive and 14 days if they test negative



Frequent hand cleaning and respiratory hygiene practices

Children will wash their hands on arrival, before and after eating, before departure and frequently throughout the day

Staff will wash their hands on arrival, before and after eating, before departure and frequently throughout the day

Essential visitors (including parents & carers) to wash hands on arrival

Boxes of tissues available & staff will encourage children to blow noses



Thorough cleaning

Thorough cleaning of all surfaces, touch points, doors, floors, toilets and sinks at end of each day

Frequently touched surfaces cleaned by staff throughout the day

Toilets & wash basins cleaned at lunchtime as well as at end of day

Resources cleaned regularly



Ventilation & learning outdoors

Doors and windows kept open to ensure good ventilation

Children encouraged to be outdoors as much as possible



Minimising contact with adults

Only essential adult visitors allowed inside the school building

Staggered start & end times for each group

Adults to maintain 2 metre social distance with other adults

Communication exchanged with parents mainly via email and telephone

Essential adult visitors (including parents & carers) to wash hands on arrival & wear a face covering on school premises

Staff may choose to wear PPE (face coverings, visors, gloves and aprons)
